UPCOMING EVENTS

Our next event will be Saturday, March 16, at Turkey Creek. The entry fee is \$66, which includes cart, prize fund and range balls. This event is our first NCGA qualifier. Renee has sent the entry form out and time is getting short, so send in your check right away, please.

Soon after the Monterey trip, TRGC will hold a tournament at Ancil Hoffman on Saturday, April 6. This event will also be stroke play, with the \$65 entry fee including cart and prize fund. Lastly in April, we will play Lincoln Hills (Hills Course) on Saturday, April 27. The \$64 entry fee includes cart, range balls and prize fund; format will be partners/best ball.

MONTERRY TRIP

The TRGC Monterey trip is set for the last week of March. We will play Carmel Valley Ranch on Thursday, March 28, and Quail Lodge on Friday, March 29. Sandy Davis will set up his usual Skins format at Carmel Valley Ranch, while Quail Lodge will be stroke play. It's a pretty nice place and very conveniently located.

NCGA QUALIFIER TOURNAMENTS

Information from Vice-President Mike Morrow: The NCGA website, www.ncga.org, has a listing for their 2019 Tournament schedule. Some of the tournaments require qualifying through your own club and some don't; the schedule on the website is broken down so you can easily see which is which. Schedule also shows the handicap level needed to enter and sites to be played. Mike called the NCGA office and was informed that registration will open at the end of January. While on the web site, everyone could also take a look at all the events the NCGA has to offer and the courses they have lined up.

NEW USGA RULES

2019 brings us many rules changes, including such novel ideas as permitting players to putt on the green with the flagstick in place and changing ball drop height from the shoulder to the knee. The new rule about putting with the flagstick in has gotten mixed reviews in the groups where I play. Some players leave it in all the time, some leave it in for long putts, and some players want the flag out all the time. We'll have to see in the coming months how golfers adapt to that rule. There are many more changes. Our Handicap Chair, Dan Nelson, has sent out summaries of all the rules changes. Also, the NCGA website noted above has the same information, as does the new USGA rules book. Check out the changes—most of the new rules are supposed to make golf easier for us!
